Special arrangements have been made to provide transportation for guests of the Centennial Celebration Commission on Saturday, May 10, 1969. The transportation schedule is as follows:

**8:00 a.m.** — Buses will depart from Salt Lake hotels and motels for Union Station.

8:20 a.m. — A second (and last) bus will depart from each hotel and motel for Union Station. (Note: The Golden Spike special train will leave Salt Lake Union Station at 9:00 a.m. sharp. Because of pressing time schedues, there will be no delay. All guests must be aboard the special train by 8:50 a.m. Your cooperation will be most appreciated.)

Once aboard the Golden Spike Special, guests will be transported from Salt Lake Union Station to Ogden, where they will board buses for the trip through Ogden and Brigham City to Promontory. Box lunches will be served aboard each bus.

When guests arrive at Promontory, guides will direct them to reserved seats appropriately marked with colored flags to match the colors on the name tags.

Following the ceremony, buses will leave Promontory for return to Ogden. All guests should be on their respective buses by 3:50 p.m. for departure promptly at 4:00 p.m. This will assure each guest an opportunity to view the Visitors Center and the Site following the ceremony.

**5:30 p.m.** — Golden Spike Special train will depart Ogden's Union Station for return to Salt Lake City.

#### **Schedules**

Because of a strict transportation schedule Saturday, and the participation of many groups, it is requested that the time requirements be met by all participants and guests. Please consult your packet for specific timetables indicated for events and activities.

For example, the Golden Spike Special scheduled to leave Salt Lake City on Saturday, May 10th, at 9:00 a.m., must depart on time in order to meet all of the requirements enroute to Promontory. You should be on board that train by 8:50 a.m.

## Name Tags

Each guest and participant of the Golden Spike Centennial Celebration has been presented an official name tag with an appropriate ribbon designation. Please wear your name tag at all official functions. It will identify you as a guest of the Golden Spike Centennial Commission and will make **6:30 p.m.** — Golden Spike Special arrives in Salt Lake; buses will return guests to hotels/motels. Returning buses will make the loop of all hotel/motel facilities, so any bus will return guests to quarters.

8:00 p.m. — Buses will depart from hotels/motels for Hotel Utah and Centennial Banquet which will commence promptly at 8:30 p.m. Following the banquet, taxi service will be available at Hotel Utah to return guests to quarters.

## National Historic Site — Promontory

The National Historic Site at Promontory Summit is operated by the National Parks Service and will be officially dedicated as part of the Centennial Celebration activities. The Promontory facility includes a Visitors Center, displays and exhibits, and sanitation facilities. You are invited on Saturday to spend some time viewing the Visitors Center at the Historic Site.
